### Catching a taxi

Wollongong Radio Cabs service the Wollongong city centre and Illawarra. You can call to book a taxi on 4229 9311 (24hours).

### Catching a train

Bus and train timetables are now integrated for your convenience. The closest train station is Wollongong. There are bus stops located nearby.

## Background

Wollongong City Council is committed to the revitalisation of the Wollongong city centre and is progressively implementing a number of key strategies. These include the Blue Mile foreshore works, city centre footpath upgrades, parking initiatives and now bus operations and bus stop improvements.

An attractive and efficient public transport system is a key element in providing for existing users as well as the planned additional 6000 city centre residents and 10000 new jobs by 2026

## City Centre Transport Plan

Council, in collaboration with key stakeholders including State Government agencies such as Transport & Infrastructure and the Roads & Traffic Authority, is implementing a three stage plan to improve bus operations, passenger amenity and vehicular access.

Stage 1 Bus stop improvements and ranking as shown in this brochure – March 2010

Stage 2 Allow southbound traffic in Keira Street (including bus priority) – June 2010

Stage 3 Allow northbound traffic in Keira Street (including bus priority) – December 2010

Additional works are planned as part of the 2005 City Centre Access & Movement Strategy.

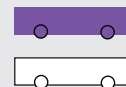

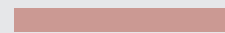
